ABOUT NORTH PARK MAIN STREET


North Park Main Street is both a business improvement district established by the City of San Diego, and a Main Street program affiliated with the National Trust for Historic Preservation. As a volunteer-based, 501(c) (6) non-profit organization, North Park Main Street (NPMS) advocates for North Park's business community, administers the North Park Business Improvement District (BID), and champions development that preserves the community's historic integrity, supports its Arts, Culture & Entertainment District, and promotes an urban, pedestrian-friendly shopping / dining environment.

Initiated by property owners and managed by the North Park Main Street Board of Directors, the North Park Property and Business Improvement District (NPPBID) provides for special benefits, improvements and enhanced services within the PBID boundaries (see attached map). The NPPBID provides a variety of improvements such as streetscape, aesthetic appeal, advocacy, safety, cleanliness, economic development, sidewalk power washing, and increased amenities. All this is funded and directed by property owners.









A WORD FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Tokyo wasn't the only place where super stars displayed skills of agility and strength. North Park had its own Olympics-of-sorts in 2021. As Covid-19 threw another curve ball our way, small business owners showed up for extra innings. The determination to jump through hoops, display composure under pressure, and dive in head-first resulted in the biggest growth year for small businesses in recent North Park history with 27 new businesses in 12 months. Existing businesses proved to be the heavy weight champions as they went head-to-head with staffing shortages, supply chain deficits, and the impact of construction along 30th Street and University Avenue.

Given all that they faced, it was still a year of celebrations. The Smoking Goat celebrated a decade in North Park, along with The UPS Store and Urbn Pizza achieving goals in longevity. Hello Birdie Nail and Lash was also in the winner's circle with a 5 year trophy, and The Girl Can't Help It, ready to hit out of the ballpark, as they enter their 10th year as the go-to destination for vintage wear.

Clearly there have been challenges, and we put our heads down for the losses, but we keep our eyes on the ball, avoid the Monday morning quarterbacking, occasionally punt to push it over the goal line and know that better days lie ahead.

FINANCIAL REVIEW: FISCAL YEAR 2021 NORTH PARK MAIN STREET

North Park Main Street is partially funded by assessments from business owners in the North Park Business Improvement District. BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT ASSESSMENT FEES

In 2021 NPMS collected \$104,632 in business assessments and another \$417,519 in funding from events, sponsorships, programs, and grants. By leveraging the assessments collected from businesses we were able to provide our members with a number of benefits including promotions and marketing, maintenance and enhancement of the public right of way, individual assistance with grants and loans, and advocacy on issues critical to a vibrant economy for small businesses. The funds collected from business assessments are an important catalyst for our endeavors, but the bulk of funding is in thanks to our sponsors, staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to provide North Park with quality services, exciting events and programs that serve the entire community.



BID FISCAL YEAR 2021 INCOME BY PERCENTAGE





- Provides street-based case management to unsheltered individuals that is personalized, trauma-informed and evidence-based.
- The goal of the Mid-City Homeless Outreach Program, a neighborhood-based collaborative, is to approach and engage homeless residents and to connect them to housing, services, and other supports.
- Specializes on listening to each individual's needs.
- The approach focuses on consistent and trustworthy engagement from a dedicated Outreach Specialist.

OUR PARTNERS AT PATH

Founded in 1984, People Assisting the Homeless (PATH) is committed to ending homelessness for individuals, families, and communities in California. PATH builds affordable supportive housing and provides homeless services in more than 150 cities in California. Their services support nearly 20 percent of the state's population experiencing homelessness. Since 2013, PATH has helped more than 12,800 people move into permanent homes.


PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY PROGRAM (PROW)



NORTH PARK INCLUSION AND DIVERSITY PRIDE MONTH


